The District 26 Spring Conference: a blow by blow account. The hotel was excellent in so many ways: service, accommodations, food, appearance features, housekeeping, response to requests and did I mention food?

The conference content introduced a few new items: a new focus on BOC, USPS Partnership with Freedom Boating Club and District Assumption of Responsibility for the organization and management of the 2017 Fall Conference in Myrtle Beach (Swamp Fox cannot muster a team to present a conference). The Freedom Boat Club (FBC) partnership is a cooperation where Squadron instructors teach safe boating to Freedom franchise members. The course criteria adapts to the local conditions at the discretion of the local franchisee. LHS&PS is working with FBC at Clemson Marina teaching an abbreviated version of ABC. If the program is as successful as it is in some of the other 115 Franchise locations we may be overwhelmed with demand for teaching. Stay tuned.

The Friday night Pirates were a great success. Costumes, bullion, contests, prizes, dancing and great food set the mood for our master yarn spinner, Judy Seeley, and her feature story on Sir Francis Drake, Queen Elizabeth the First's very special privateer (pirate). Drake harassed the Spanish main in the pacific and the gulf returning to England with millions in gold and silver. The pirate costume parade was won by the man eating parrot and her escort pirate.

Saturdays conference yielded some clarity on co op charting and USPS remains in the co op charting business. The big change is the closing of a reporting system known as Depth Wiz which dealt with depth surveys. Depth Wiz operated in a window called CCWeb which was in danger

of compromise by hacking and has been abandoned. No schedule for replacement is announced. But, the remainder of coastal reporting is intact: shoaling, damaged and missing Atons, and other information can be reported to the Coast Guard and or NOS (National Oceanic Service) a part of NOAA (National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration). Perhaps more important, because of the collapse of the CCWeb site USPS has lost the ability to recognize and reward the membership (recognition) for the civic service of performing co op charting. Seems to be a lack of imagination and effort.

Saturday evening featured another great meal followed by an award program that seems to recognize almost everyone for something. The day's activities concluded with a visit to the Hospitality Suite.

On Sunday morning seven hearty souls joined the Sunday cruise on which we toured the Seneca River from its confluence with the Savannah to the waters off Clemson University. The two and a half hour journey experienced good weather: sunny, clear, a five MPH breeze and only a mild chill. No problem for these sailors as blankets and jackets protected all and the cruise was very pleasant.

- c. Several Co-op Charting certificates were received, including Russ Dunston, Ray Fedele, Pete Stevenson, Jef Lockman and Jim Carroll. - d. LHS&PS ranked 14th in the nation for Co-op charting. LHS&PS has been on the honor roll for 13 years.
- e. There has been some confusion concerning the NOAA website, Co op charting and the awards program. One sub section of the NOAA was dedicated to integrating information from depth surveys using a program called "depthwiz". This site has been shut down because it has been determined to be vulnerable to hacking. The immediate result is that USPS can no longer submit depth surveys. A secondary result is that the Co op charting recognition program is suspended. No information is available as to when and if the awards will resume.
- f. LHS&PS received a certificate of appreciation from the Corp of Engineers.
- q. National has informed the squadrons of a dues increase starting June 2017.
- h. There are now 14 squadrons in SC with the new addition of Dreher Shoals on Lake Murray.
- i. Bert Baxter was awarded the "Order Of Mariners" title of *Mariner* along with the accompanying silver star.
