The purpose of this event is to share our experience on the lake with members of the public. The vehicle is to take passengers along on several co op charting cruises. Co op charting is a program in which we inspect navigation aids on the lake, submit a report to the Corps of Engineers and the Corps causes repairs to be made.

This program of inviting the public to go along started in December 2017 with a notice in the news paper which prompted a surprising level of interest. Such strong interest that the December schedule for co op charting was overwhelmed, too many people for too few boats and SHAZAM the Jamboree was created. The program:

12: 00 PM meet at Portman Marina launch ramp area (the courtesy dock) and the small tournament pavilion at the land side of the courtesy dock at 12 noon. We will have hot dogs and soft drinks available. 12:15 a very short presentation on what co op charting is, what we will be doing during the afternoon and a comment or two on who and what we are.

In the background we will be matching boats, captains, inspectors and passengers.

12:30 The several teams will depart the dock and travel a short distance to the assigned areas. For those folks who want to look over a lake chart to see where we will be going there are three areas. The lower portion of the Seneca River, the lower half and upper half of 26 Mile Creek. Should the crowd be large enough a fourth area would be to circumnavigate Anderson Island. At least one and probably both of our members on each boat will be knowledgeable about the specific area they are to cruise in.

In addition to the main subject: cooperative charting, our team members will also be available to discuss almost any boating subject including navigation aids, boat handling etc.

To insure that we have enough hot dogs, drinks, boats, captains and inspectors it is a must that you confirm by email to me that you plan to participate. Please be sure to add your email, telephone and any other important contact information. Regrettably I do not function on social media so communication channels that will work are email, telephone and text.

When crew members have little or no boating experience they may be confused and unprepared when emergencies arise. Do you know how to call for help on a marine radio? In emergency situations, there is no time to sit and read a manual, so the time to learn some basic skills is before the emergency arises. This seminar will not make you an expert, but will provide the basic knowledge to help deal with emergency situations.

### Thursday, April 12 Maritime Rules of the Road: Understanding Your Responsibilities

When you skipper a vessel, you have a set of legal responsibilities to protect lives and property on the water. This seminar will help you grasp the Rules of the Road, by providing explanations and examples of the 37 Rules of the Road. It simplifies the sometimes complex law relating to boat operation for the recreational boater.
